## Transfer Credit

At most two transfer credits may be counted toward the major or minor, but transfer credit cannot be used to satisfy the Advanced Seminar (PHIL 50.xy) and Culminating Experience (PHIL 80.xy) requirements.

## FSP: Edinburgh

PHIL 50.xy, 60, 61

Depending on the subject, these courses may satisfy distributive requirements for the major (e.g., the history of philosophy requirement). Any student who wants such credit should petition the chair of the Philosophy Department at Dartmouth.

## Non-Recording Option

A standing of NR prevents the course from being used to satisfy:

- Distributive requirements
- World Culture requirements
- Major requirements

An NR may, however, be used to satisfy:

- Prerequisite courses to the major
- At most one course in the minor, including prerequisite courses
